CAMP SIENA PACKING LIST

PLEASE BRING

- Summer clothing for 5 days
- One piece or tankini swimsuit (if two-piece, then a dark t-shirt must be worn over it)
- Beach towel
- Sunscreen
- Life vest to use for the River (optional)
- Personal toiletry items, such as:
 - Soap, shampoo
 - Deodorant
 - Toothbrush, toothpaste
 - Over the Counter and prescription drugs (check in upon arrival)
 - Bath towel
 - Shower shoes (optional)
- 2 pairs of athletic shoes (1 that can get muddy)
- 1 pair water shoes (or sandals that wrap around the ankles) for the float trip
- Bedding (twin sheet and blanket or Sleeping bag) and pillow
- Rain coat or sweatshirt (optional)
- Flashlight
- Bug Spray
- Reusable water bottle with name
- One dressier outfit (for the final night of camp)

PLEASE DO NOT BRING:

- Tents
- Air Mattresses
- Digital and electronic devices
- Snacks (snacks are provided by camp)
- Flip-Flops or Crocs (except to use for shower)
- Weapons of any kind: pocket knives, fireworks, lighters, matches.
- Tobacco products, alcohol, illegal drugs.

OTHER ITEMS TO NOTE:

- Please consider the weather and the various outdoor activities you will be doing throughout the week of camp as you pack.
- Make sure that shirts are appropriate for a faith-based environment. Shirts with sexual innuendo, sarcasm or demeaning sayings are not permitted. Shirts, pants, shorts, swimwear, etc should be modest in dress and appropriate for a Catholic activity.
